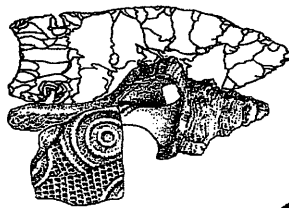

THE PANHANDLE ARCHAEOLOGICAL SOCIETY AT TALLAHASSEE, INC.

The Panhandle Archaeological Society at Tallahassee (PAST) is a non-profit group dedicated to promoting the exploration and preservation of archaeological resources in the Florida panhandle region. PAST is a chapter of the Florida Anthropological Society, and recognized by the State of Florida as a not-for-profit corporation.

Membership is open to all interested persons, including professional archaeologists, students, avocational archaeologists, and those simply interested in learning more about local archaeology and cultural history.

PAST GOALS

- 1) To effect harmony and cooperation among amateur, avocational, and professional archaeologists for the identification and protection of archaeological resources in the Florida panhandle;
- 2) To inform and enlighten the public as to the region's rich cultural history and the need to preserve it;
- 3) To establish and promote a code of ethics to guide society members and the general public to the appropriate procedures in dealing with archaeological resources.

FIELD ACTIVITIES

The Society's activities include the entire range of endeavors undertaken by archaeologists: the survey of lands for archaeological sites, the excavation of sites, the preservation and curation of artifacts, and the presentation of the Society's activities to the public and interested groups. All projects are supervised by trained archaeologists who are members of the Society and who will train non-professional members in the techniques and skills required to complete project tasks. Projects may be undertaken on weekends or whenever time, resources, and funding are available.

SPEAKERS AND DEMONSTRATIONS

In addition to field projects, the Society hosts guest speakers from around the region who present on a wide range of subjects pertaining to archaeology. Also, Society-sponsored workshops are occasionally held to teach archeological field techniques to the interested public. Workshops in native crafts, such as stone tool manufacture, and demonstrations of skills, such as atlatl throwing and the use of the black powder rifle.
